

reference to her illness. He stated that the doctors were [REDACTED] and her primary physician was [REDACTED]. He stated that he and his [REDACTED] had been tending to her needs and taking care of her throughout her illness. He went on to state that she had numerous tests done and was taking numerous medications in reference to her illness, which was cancer. He stated that he had numerous medical reports and a number of doctors involving his wife's care and he would provide the Sayreville Police Department or any other agency with the information regarding [REDACTED]. He further stated that hospice was also involved [REDACTED] and he had all the information in reference to contacting the hospice nurses. He further stated on [REDACTED] she was [REDACTED] Hospital where she had MRI's for fractures of her back. On 7-29-05, she weighed approximately 91 pounds, but he got her back to 112 pounds. In August, 2005, he stated that she was so weak that she could not get out of bed and he would carry her to the bathroom. During this phase of the illness, [REDACTED] stated that he wanted her back in the hospital and [REDACTED] stated she could not even walk at this time. He stated she also had another doctor at [REDACTED] Hospital, Dr. [REDACTED] who had set up 15 appointments for radiation for her cancer treatment. He stated this officer or any other officer could check with [REDACTED] of Holmdel and the other doctors involved in his wife's illness. During this interview, he stated he would like this officer to speak with his [REDACTED]. I explained to him that that was not necessary and I would contact her at a later date. [REDACTED] actually insisted and he did call her from the Detective Bureau. This officer overheard the conversation on speaker phone and it did not appear that [REDACTED] was waiting for this phone call, but in fact he requested her to come to our Headquarters and speak to this officer in reference to the care provided to her mother. She agreed and responded to Headquarters at approximately 1445 hours. She spoke to this officer in reference to her mother's care. During this interview with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], this officer made reference to speaking with Bill Strauss in Florida, who is Joyce Sauter's brother, regarding the care that was provided to his sister, Joyce. I stated to [REDACTED] that I was advised she was
