

afraid of her stepfather, [REDACTED]. At this time, [REDACTED] actually stood up and moved the chair she was sitting in closer to [REDACTED] and stated "Do I look like someone who is afraid of him?" This officer advised them that the other concerns from family members were the care that was provided to Joyce Sauter regarding her cancer treatment. [REDACTED] stated that he had conversations and discussions with family members in reference to her care, stated both he and his [REDACTED] provided all the care they could give to Joyce Sauter, and [REDACTED] actually left her job to tend to her mother and he was not working and was taking care of Joyce during her illness. They both indicated during this interview they tried to have Joyce eat whenever she could by actually using an eyedropper to give her fluids so she would be ingesting something whenever it was possible. During this interview, [REDACTED] provided this officer with a copy of a handwritten letter dated 3-14-05 that stated "I, Joyce/Joy B. Sauter, wish to make it known that upon my death I shall be cremated. No funeral home, no coffin, contact [REDACTED] I want to be cremated, put in a bag/box, and disposed of as soon as reasonably possible. My ashes are to be turned out into the ocean on any quiet area of Sandy Hook, NJ. Including [REDACTED] the only people I want to view me after my death are my two daughters, [REDACTED]. This is my wish. Everyone else can remember me alive and happy. Joy/Joyce Sauter." He provided this officer with a social security card for Joyce Sauter, [REDACTED] with the signature so this officer could see the signature on the letter matched the signature on the social security card. This officer then stated that during the conversation with Bill Strauss, it was mentioned that [REDACTED] had told Bill Strauss that [REDACTED] had made mention that the family wanted another Schiavo case. This officer understood this to mean the case which occurred in Florida in reference to a terminally ill woman being involved in court proceedings. This officer mentioned that to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], at which time [REDACTED] stated that yes, [REDACTED] did say that to me in reference to being concerned. [REDACTED] then stood up and said yes, he did say that, but indicated that he meant it in reference to not causing Joyce any further problems. After speaking to [REDACTED] this officer spoke with both
