Prior to giving this statement, [REDACTED] will be read her Miranda Warnings in reference to the statement.

Q. [REDACTED], You have the right to remain silent. Anything you say can be used against you in a court of law. You have the right to talk to a lawyer and have a lawyer present with you while you are being questioned. If you cannot afford to hire a lawyer, one will be appointed to represent you before any questioning, if you wish one. You can decide to exercise these rights at any time and not answer any questions or make any statements. Do you understand that?
A. Yes.

Q. Okay, the time is 1424 hours. Okay, if you would, just initial this side and sign this side and we'll witness it. Sign the top, [REDACTED] on top. Sign right there. Okay. And just initial the other side. Okay. On the bottom, yeah, that's fine. Okay. [REDACTED] also present as mentioned before is Det. Amy Noble, Sayreville Police Department Narcotics Bureau. [REDACTED] are you willing to speak to me in reference to, it's actually a report that was taken, or an incident that occurred back on, you're probably easier to tell me, but October 29th, 2005. This was a hospice death which was in reference to your mother, is that correct?
A. Yes.

Q. Okay. Okay. [REDACTED] what is your full name?
