You folks have an opportunity to go the extra mile and protect Joyce's civil rights, even in her death. What will it hurt to rule out suffocation and starvation, not just over medication? In the end it could either completely clear [REDACTED] of any wrong doing, or provide sufficient evidence to take to a grand jury. Please think outside the box and please go the extra mile.

Carolyn and I very much appreciate the information provided to us, beginning yesterday, and hope that our communication lines will now remain open through closure.
